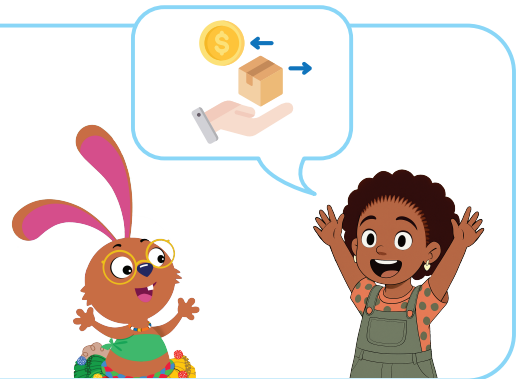


Financial Literacy Worksheet 5: Entrepreneurship (Ages 10–12)

Story Time: Afrika & Coco Start a Business

They buy ingredients for R60 and make 20 cups of juice. They sell each cup for R8. At the end of the day, they count their money and learn about income, expenses, and profit.
